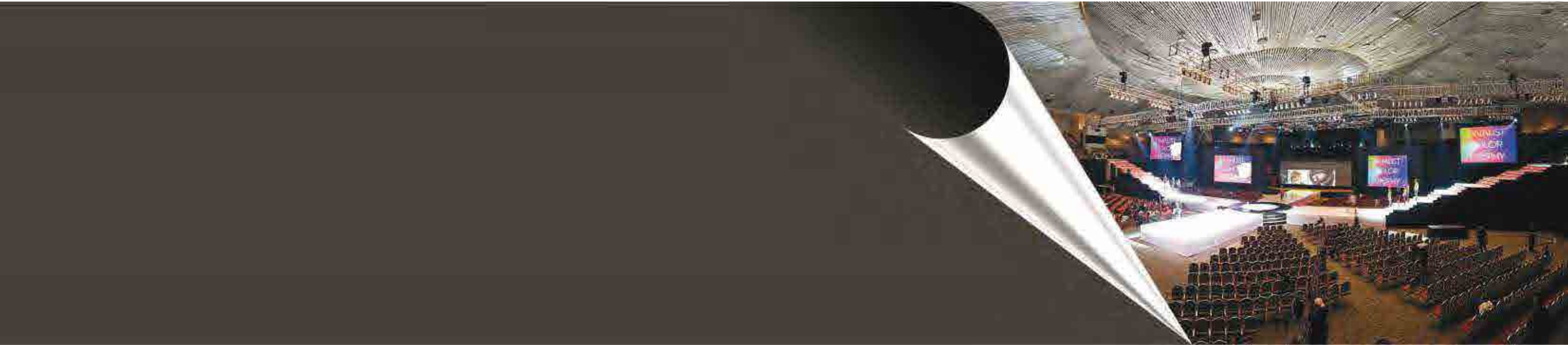
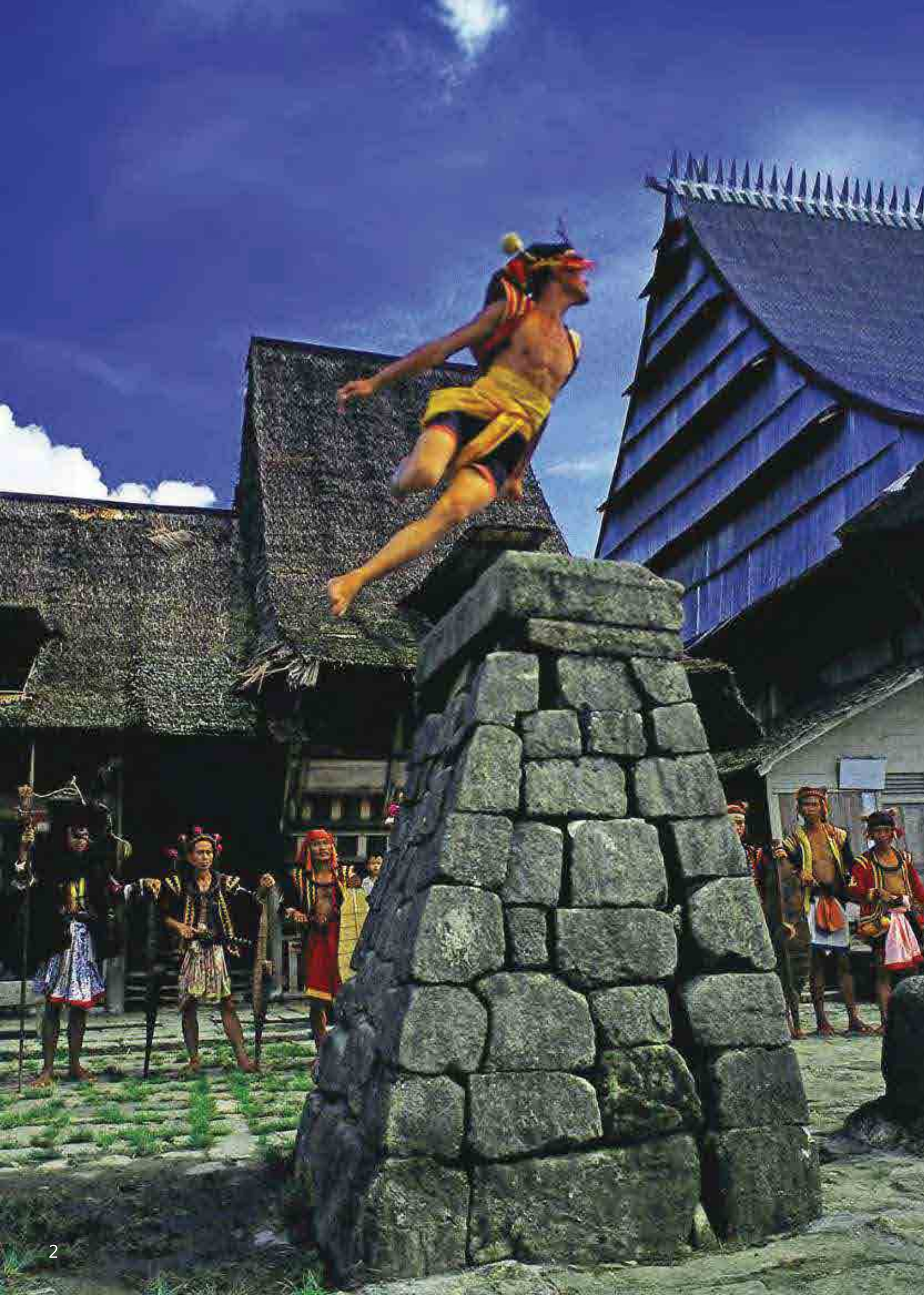

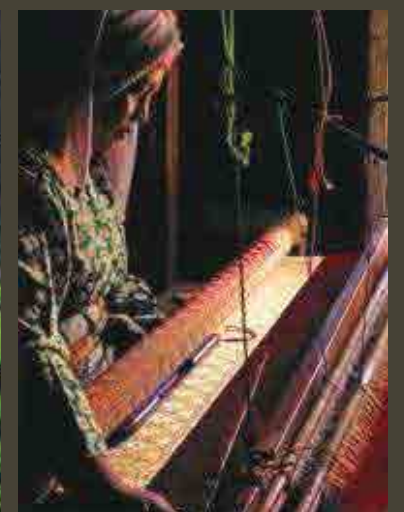


Indonesia

With wooden furnishings, marble walls, and a glossy granite floor, the Main Lobby, pictured above, offers a stylish 5,500 sqm of versatile space for exhibitions, pre-conference registrations, coffee breaks, and buffets. Accessed through the Main Lobby are the 5000-seat Plenary Hall, the Assembly Hall, and the Cendrawasih Room – the latter two of which can be divided into smaller rooms to fit your engagement requirements. Ethernet access is available in all public areas.

Plenary Hall



With ground floor and mezzanine seating for 5,000 guests, and multiple entrance and exit points, the Plenary Hall provides a theater-style venue for the grandest of international meetings and the greatest of contemporary pop stars. The Plenary Hall has hosted the United Nations/ESCAP High-Level Regional Consultative Meeting on Financing for Development, the 2005 Asian-African Summit, the Indonesian Petroleum Association's annual conventions and exhibitions, APEC meetings, the 2007 Special ASEAN Leader's Meeting on the Aftermath of the Earthquake and Tsunami, and concerts by Il Divo, Julio Iglesias, Mariah Carey, Toto, Lionel Richie, Al Jerrau, and Sting, among others.

The Plenary Hall is fitted with sophisticated audio visual equipment: a 6.72m x 4.80m LED display, digital conference microphones, and a simultaneous interpretation system.



Assembly Hall

At 3,921 sqm, our Assembly Hall is the largest banquet room in Indonesia, seating 2,500 guests for sit-down dinners or 4,500 guests for buffets and receptions. The Assembly Hall is suitable for conferences, balls, wedding receptions, lectures and classes, dinners and luncheons, theater productions, fashion shows, music and dance performances, exhibitions, product launches, and awards ceremonies.

The sheer size of the Assembly Hall gives immense flexibility: movable floor-to-ceiling partitions can divide the hall into three separate rooms, tailoring the space to precisely meet your requirements, or enabling you to hold different functions simultaneously.





Cendrawasih Room

From bustling craft fairs to formal roundtables, the Cendrawasih Room's 2,109 sqm of flexible space suit all engagement types. The Cendrawasih Room is fitted with interpreter booths supporting the simultaneous interpretation system, and conference microphones with voting systems. Portable walls can divide the Cendrawasih Room into smaller engagement rooms.



Need a place to showcase a great new product line? We have the space: 9,585 sqm of space! The Jakarta Convention Center has two vast exhibition halls – each with their own 1,000 sqm lobby entrance and choices of access. Both halls are fully equipped to accommodate all manner of exhibitions: from heavy machinery to delicate beauty products.

Hall A covers 3,060 sqm with a floor load of 1,200 kg/sqm; while Hall B spans 6,075 sqm with a floor load of 1,500 kg/sqm. Both halls have a ceiling height of 9 m, and are equipped with telephone and communication outlets. Hall A has a distribution frame capable of handling 450 pairs of telephone lines, while Hall B handles up to 500 pairs.

Both halls are fitted with audio visual points, single and 3-phase power sources, and floor box access to electricity, phone lines, and water and compressed air on request. The two halls can be connected through a 450 sqm corridor and have direct truck access to facilitate easy loading.

Bonded Warehouse

Lower Lobby

The elegant ambience of the Lower Lobby is ideal for exhibitions, receptions, event registrations, and coffee breaks.

Accessed through the Lower Lobby are nine smaller meeting rooms, two of which, the Nuri and the Merak, can be further subdivided for cozier events. These rooms are ideal for conferences, board meetings, lectures, workshops and seminars, lunches and dinners, exhibitions and product launches, fashion shows and weddings, concerts and religious events, and graduation and awards ceremonies. The rooms vary in size accommodating between 20 and 1,000 guests.



Summit Room

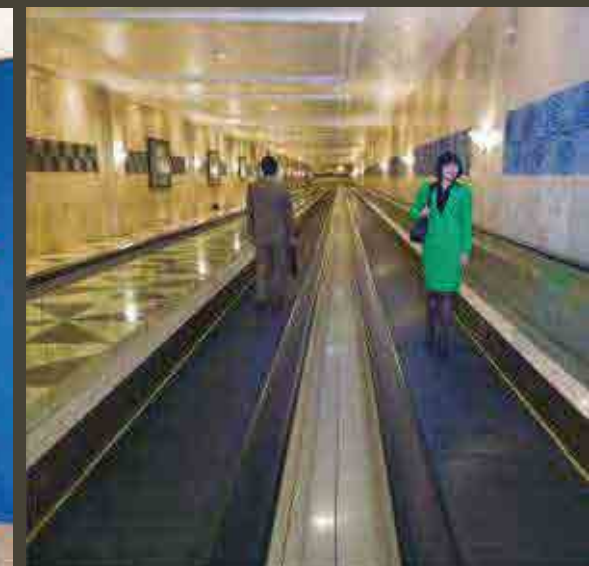

Technical Equipment



Our state of the art sound, lighting, and communications facilities provide you with seamless technical support. Portable equipment includes a 150" to 300" screen for front and rear projection; high ANSI Lumens LCD projectors and LED modules for large screen displays; portable conference microphones; 8 portable interpreter booths and 1,200 infrared receivers to support the simultaneous interpretation system; 72,000 watts of loud speakers with audio mixing consoles; 300,000 watts of stage lighting including moving-head and conventional lighting; heavy duty aluminum trusses, and electrical and manual chain hoists. Communications facilities include a hybrid system for teleconferencing via the public telephone network; ISDN network terminals; a long reach Ethernet facility, and wireless access for all bandwidths.

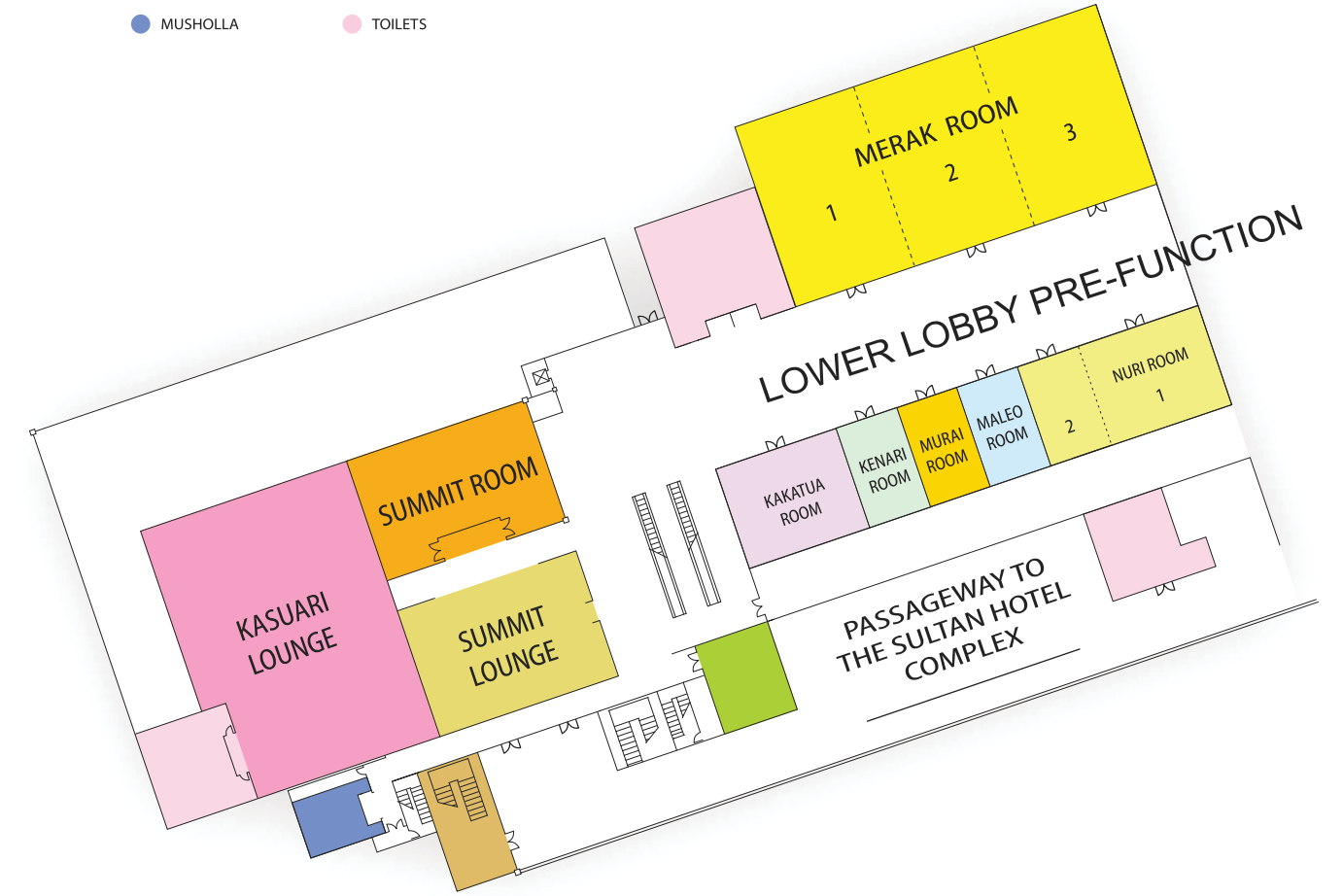

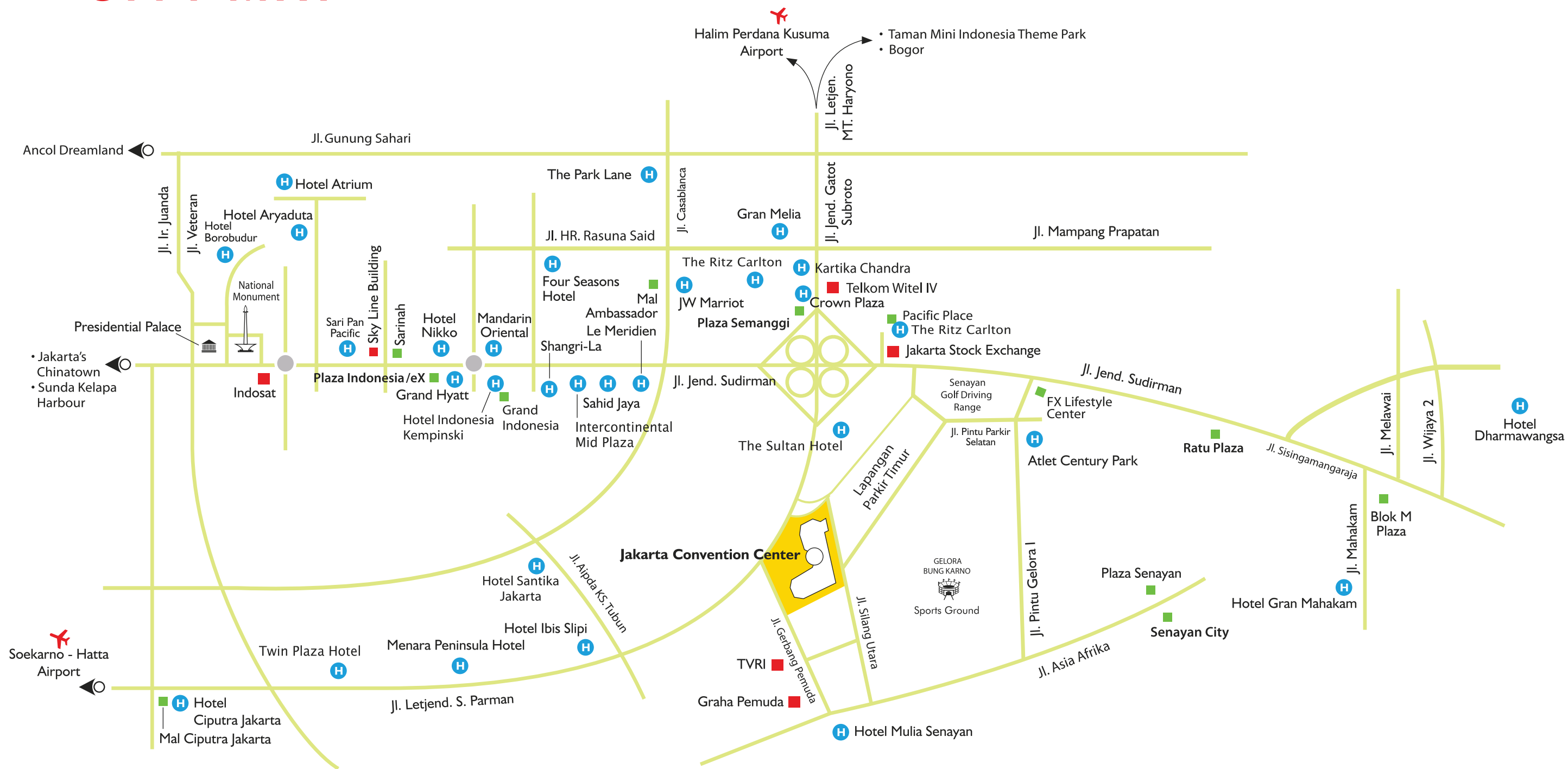
